### **CAP Directors Report**

December 2018

### **Adult Athletics**

Jazzercise continued through the month of December as Endure and Pilates came to an end early December. Endure will be starting up early January and Pilates will begin in March.

# **Aquatics**

16 individuals renewed or purchased punch passes/memberships in December. This gave a total of 224 for the year. The lifeguard certification course took place over break with 9 participants passing the course. Elementary School PE classes will begin their swimming in January as well.

# **CAP CARE**

In December CAP CARE received a grant from the Cambridge Foundation to purchase 4 age appropriate bikes with helmets and safety signs. We will be using these bikes during the summer on our biking days. This will allow us to let all children participate in biking both at the school and on the trail. Children will also be allowed to bring a bike from home if their family chooses.

We also were able to enroll 3 new children from our waiting list which brought our waiting list down to 12 in December. Our 4K interest list for the 2019-2020 school year is now up to 12 children.

# **Community Café**

The Community Cafe was hosted by the School District of Cambridge and served 211 individuals breakfast for dinner.

#### **Food Pantry**

The Food Pantry served 88 households to which included 155 adults and 87 children in the month of December. 75 Blue Jay backpacks were distributed in December as well. The Food Pantry was hoping for special hours in December as two of the Mondays were holidays.

#### **Ripley Park**

Holiday lights has officially concluded as of January 1. In December, one of the displays was damaged due to vandalism, which unfortunately was not caught on camera. A formal report with Jefferson County was filed. CAP did not make an insurance claim per the advisement of the insurance representative. The posting of the Lead Grounds Keeper position will be up by the end of January.

#### **Seniors**

On December 5, the senior meal was held at the Presbyterian Church of Oakland-Cambridge to which 35 seniors enjoyed ham duchess potatoes and corn watching the Utica Christian School Choir perform holiday music.

#### **Youth Athletics**

Lil' Jays girls basketball came to a conclusion and it was another successful, fun filled season. Basketball FUNdamentals began and the numbers are strong for all grades (K - 3). The CHS girls basketball coaches and players are helping facilitate the FUNdamentals program this year. The 3rd grade FUNdamental teams are working learning offensive and defensive plays and will be participating in a tournament at the end of the season.

### **Youth Center**

The Youth Center sustained regular attendance for the month and hosted another After Hours event on Friday, December 14. Sixteen students attended having subs for a light dinner and enjoyed holiday themed games and activities. Additionally over the holiday break, the Youth Center was repainted thanks to the help and support of Flores Painting. Both rooms were completed which included the cabinets being repainted with white board paint. Chad is continuing to oversee the project on multiple fronts including securing funding, working with contractors, and is also being assisted by Kelly Blanchar to finalize the furniture order set to be completed in late January.

# **Youth Enrichment**

The STEM for Kids (Web Design) class wrapped un in December with the next STEM class beginning in early January. The December Parent's Night Out had 9 kids participate. First Friends maxed out (16) for all of the classes in December. This program is in high demand and has many children on the waitlist.
