## Board of Directors

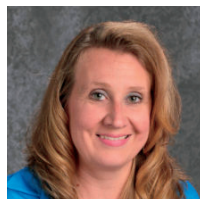

# GENERAL INFORMATION

You Snooze...You Lose! If you would like to participate in one of our programs, please register in advance of the registration deadline. One week prior to the start date, we determine if enrollment is sufficient to hold the program. By registering early, you will assist us in providing the best organization and administration of all programs. Your cooperation in registering early will ensure all participants and instructors are given ample time to prepare for programs.

## REGISTRATION

Registration for recreation programs must be received one week prior to the start date. Please note all beginning dates on programs as to not miss a session. Registration for youth and adult sports leagues is specified in that particular section of the brochure. If registrations are received more than seven days after the due date, registration is not guaranteed and may incur additional expenses. No email registrations will be accepted; phone registrations will be accepted with credit card payment. Registration is taken on a first come, first served basis and programs may fill up quickly. Spots will not be held without payment.

## REGISTRATION OPTIONS

- **Option #1: Online**  
Using our website, [www.cambridgecap.net](http://www.cambridgecap.net), click on "Register Now." This will direct you to our secure, online registration database. Click on "Click Here to Log In and Register." You will be guided through a process of creating a family login and password that you will use each time you register. At the end of the registration you will need to pay with a credit card. You will then receive a registration confirmation and receipt via email to complete the process.
- **Option #2: Mail**

Drop off the registration form and payment to the main CAP office, located in the Cambridge High School. Please use the District Office entrance at the high school. Forms may also be dropped off at the Cambridge Community Pool or the Cambridge CAP Youth Center.
- **Option #4: Phone**  
Contact our main office at (608) 423-8108 to register over the phone, and pay via visa or mastercard
- **Option #5: Drop Box**  
Registrations forms may be dropped in our drop box, located outside of the District Office doors at the Cambridge High School. Registration confirmation a receipt of payment will be provided via email for all registrations to the email address provided in your online account. If you do not receive a receipt you may not be registered. Please contact the CAP office to inquire at (608) 423-8108.

## FEES

It is the policy of the Community Activities Program that those who participate in Community Activities Programs should help subsidize the overall cost of that activity. Therefore, fees are assessed to activities based on the needs of that particular activity.

The first program fees listed in the brochure are for Cambridge School District residents (R). To qualify for the resident fee, you must reside in the Cambridge School District or attend Cambridge Schools. Residents support the school district through tax-dollars, while non-residents pay to participate through higher registration fees. All participants must pay in full at the time of registration; however, participation in programs to School District residents will not be denied due to financial constraints.



## PHOTO POLICY

The Cambridge Community Activities Program uses pictures of participants in bulletins and displays to inform others of our recreational opportunities. If you do not want a participant's picture taken, you must inform the Director in writing prior to the start of the program.

## REFUND POLICY\*

A full refund will be issued if a program is canceled by CAP due to low enrollment or a facility usage conflict.

- If a participant voluntarily withdraws from a program prior to the program's registration deadline, he/she will receive a refund for the amount paid minus a \$3 processing fee. If payment was made via credit card, the credit card will be refunded. All other payment types will receive a refund in check form.
- If a participant withdraws after the program has begun for extenuating circumstances, or if a participant is unhappy with the program, they may submit their concerns in writing to the CAP Director. CAP may then issue a refund less the \$3 processing fee, in the Director's discretion.

# CAP CARE

CAP CARE is a state licensed group child care facility that provides enrichment based, wrap around care and programming for children in grades 4K – 4th grade. CAP CARE is located in the Cambridge Elementary School, Room 130 – 131, & 135.

**Fee:** Initial \$30 registration fee.

- **3K:** \$60 per day or \$250 per week.  
Fee also includes attendance in First Friends
- **4K – 4th grade:** \$4.75 per hour for care.  
Parents will fill out a monthly calendar by the 21st of the preceding month of the date and times their child will be attending. No refunds/credit will be given for any missed dates (including illness). Snacks are included in the fee. Lunch (\$3.45) may be purchased for an additional fee.

**Payments:** CAP CARE accepts check, cash or credit card.

## Minimum Attendance:

- **3K:** A child must attend a minimum of two times per week.
- **4K:** A child must attend a minimum of three times per week.
- **K – 4:** A child must attend a minimum of four times per week. This may be a combination of morning and/or afternoon periods.

## CAP CARE:

- Will operate on early release days
- Will operate on non – school days (except for major holidays)
- Will NOT operate during emergency closing days due to weather

**Hours of Operation:** 6:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.

### • 4K WRAP AROUND CARE

Registration for 4K 2024 – 2025 will open in February. 4K children can be in morning or afternoon 4K at CES.

### • 3K WRAP AROUND CARE

Registration for 3K's 2024 – 2025 school year will open May 1st. Children must be old enough to enter 4K during the 2024 – 2025 school year.

## RECREATIONAL SOCCER

Volunteer coaches are needed to make CAP soccer programs a success! Spring: Wednesday, March 6 at 6:00 p.m., Fall: Wednesday, August 14 at 6:00 p.m. both in the CHS Lecture Lab. Coaches in attendance will receive the 50% off coaching discount!

In this fun, exciting, recreational soccer league your child will learn fundamentals, rules and basic plays. Games are played at 8:00 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m., or 11:00 a.m., depending on registration numbers. Practices are held for the different teams at the discretion of their respective coaches. You will be contacted by a coach regarding your child's team assignment. Shin guards are MANDATORY at all levels. Cleats are not required but are recommended.

## 4K Division

Open to children currently in 4K, this division is a 4K only group that is the base level introduction to the sport focusing on a few skills. This group will only meet on Saturdays and will be in a practice format (with parent involvement). Full games will not be played.

## Kindergarten/1st Grade Division (U6)

Open to children currently enrolled in kindergarten or first grade. U6 is intended to be the next progression in the soccer skill development, with continued focus on the fundamentals of the game and having fun. This division will practice weekly and also play on Saturday mornings. Children will play small sided soccer (3 on 3) on small sized fields (25 X 30 yards). They play four 8 minute quarters; referees and goalies are not used at this level.

## 2nd/3rd Grade Division (U8)

Designed for children in grades 2 and 3; children will continue to develop basic skills, while also learning advanced gameplay and strategy in a fun relaxed environment. Teams will play 4 on 4, on a 30 X 30 yard field. They will play four 10 minute quarters; referees and goalies are not used at this level.

## 4th/5th Grade Division (U10)

The U10 program will be offered to children in grades 4 – 5 with the intent of this division to continue growth in the sport, while also preparing players for the next progression to either GDU or other more organized soccer leagues. This division will practice at least one day a week outside of regular scheduled games.

## LITTLE LEAGUE

The Cambridge CAP participates in the Eastern Suburban Youth Baseball League, which includes the surrounding communities of Columbus, Cottage Grove, Deerfield, Fall River, Jefferson, Lake Mills, Marshall, McFarland, Monona, and Waterloo. For more information, please log onto <http://esybl.org>. Uniform tops are provided for both Little League groups; players are required to wear gray pants to match. First year players are provided with a hat. Returning players may purchase replacements by contacting the CAP main office at (608) 423-8108.

There is a mandatory spring "Warm-Up" day for all boys interested in playing American or National League on Saturday, April 6 from 12:00 p.m. – 1:30 p.m. for NL and 2:00 p.m. – 3:30 p.m. for AL at the CHS Baseball Fields.

Any parent interested in coaching is asked to inform Martin Bathke and attend the coaches' meeting set for Thursday, March 21 at 6:00 p.m. in the CHS Lecture Lab. Coaches attending the meeting will receive a 50% discount on their child's registration!

## ESYBL LITTLE LEAGUE (NATIONAL OR AMERICAN LEAGUE)

**Dates:** Mid May thru late July

**Grades:** 3 – 6

**Fee:** \$65 R / \$80 NR (before March 8)  
\$75 R / \$90 NR (after March 8)

Participants registered for Little League should plan to attend the mandatory "Warm Up Day" on April 6 to have basic skills assessed. Player assessment will be used in creation of both National and American League teams. National League teams will play regularly on Mondays and Wednesdays, and American League teams play on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Practices will start early May, 3 weeks prior to first game and will continue during the season at the discretion of the team and coach's availability. Parent transportation is required and teams have an opportunity to participate in one local rec tournament during, or up to one month after the regular season.

## PONY LEAGUE

**Dates:** Early June thru late July

**Grade:** 7 (2023 – 2024 school year)

**Fee:** \$70 R / \$85 NR (before March 8)  
\$80 R / \$95 NR (after March 8)  
(10 player minimum at deadline)

Pony League is a traveling baseball league (parent transportation required) designed to transition players from Little League to Teener League baseball. The schedule will be set by the league and players will be contacted in regards to practices and games. Uniforms are provided; players are asked to purchase blue socks. There will be a coaches meeting on Thursday, March 21 at 6:00 p.m. in the CHS Lecture Lab. Coaches attending the meeting will receive a 50% discount on their child's registration!

## UPPER LEVEL LEAGUE BASEBALL PROGRAMS

In conjunction with the CHS Baseball Program, the CAP offers summer baseball for kids who are going into grades 9 – 12. Summer baseball is a great way for players to build upon their skills and provides an opportunity to strengthen the CHS team. Teener teams are offered based on registration numbers and teams are assigned based on age and skill. The Teener program is operated under the guidance of the high school coaching staff. This League is designed to provide players with an opportunity to participate at a high level of competition, with a goal of state tournament play in mind. Therefore, a commitment to area travel, practices, games, and work ethic are expected for these leagues. Playing times in games may not be equal and skill levels, attendance, attitude, sportsmanship, and commitment will be used to determine playing time.

Teener is a traveling, competitive baseball league (parent transportation required). The schedule will be set by the coach and players will be contacted in regards to practices and games. Uniforms are provided; players are asked to purchase blue socks. Teener coaches meeting will be on Thursday, March 21 at 6:00 p.m. in the CHS Lecture Lab. Coaches attending the meeting will receive a 50% discount on their child's registration!

## ASA WINDMILL SOFTBALL

**Dates:** Mid May thru late July

The Cambridge CAP participates in an ASA sanctioned Windmill Girls' Fast Pitch League. Girls are divided into leagues according to their age; cutoff is the age as of September 1, 2023. All levels of CAP Softball are traveling leagues with games played both at home and away (parent transportation required). 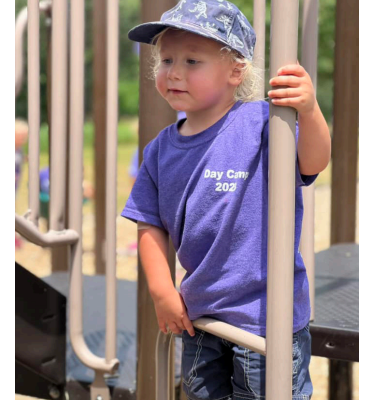
