# **GENERAL INFORMATION**

You Snooze...You Lose! If you would like to participate in one of our programs, please register in advance of the registration deadline. One week prior to the start date, we determine if enrollment is sufficient to hold the program. By registering early, you will assist us in providing the best organization and administration of all programs. Your cooperation in registering early will ensure all participants and instructors are given ample time to prepare for programs.

# REGISTRATION

Registration for recreation programs must be received one week prior to the start date. Please note all beginning dates on programs as to not miss a session. Registration for youth and adult sports leagues is specified in that particular section of the brochure. If registrations are received more than seven days after the due date, registration is not guaranteed and may incur additional expenses. No email registrations will be accepted; phone registrations will be accepted with credit card payment. Registration is taken on a first come, first served basis and programs may fill up quickly. Spots will not be held without payment.

The Cambridge Community Activities Program is committed to creating an inclusive and welcoming environment for everyone. We recognize and respect that not all individuals identify strictly as male or female. We invite all registrants who identify outside the traditional gender binary to join us in our programs. We aim to provide a supportive space where everyone can participate fully and authentically. Your identity and experiences are valued, and we are here to ensure you have a positive and enriching experience. Please feel free to share any specific needs or accommodations you may require with our Executive Director to help us make your participation comfortable and enjoyable.

# **REGISTRATION OPTIONS**

- Option #1: Online Using our website, www.cambridgecap.net, click on "Register Now." This will direct you to our secure, online registration database. Click on "Click Here to Log In and Register." You will be guided through a process of creating a family login and password that you will use each time you register. At the end of the registration you will need to pay with a credit card. You will then receive a registration confirmation and receipt via email to complete the process.
- Option #2: Mail Registration form at www.cambridgecap.net and payment may be mailed to: Cambridge Community Activities Program, PO Box 54, Cambridge, WI 53523
  - Option #3: Walk-In

Drop off the registration form and payment to the main CAP office, located in the Cambridge High School. Please use the District Office entrance at the high school. Forms may also be dropped off at the Cambridge Community Pool or the Cambridge CAP Youth Center.

- Option #4: Phone Contact our main office at (608) 423-8108 to register over the phone, and pay via visa or mastercard
- Option #5: Drop Box Registrations forms may be dropped in our drop box, located outside of the District Office doors at the Cambridge High School. Registration confirmation - a receipt of payment will be provided via email for all registrations to the email address provided in your online account. If you do not receive a receipt you may not be registered. Please contact the CAP office to inquire at (608) 423-8108.

#### FEES

It is the policy of the Community Activities Program that those who participate in Community Activities Programs should help subsidize the overall cost of that activity. Therefore, fees are assessed to activities based on the needs of that particular activity.

The first program fees listed in the brochure are for Cambridge School District residents (R). To qualify for the resident fee, you must reside in the Cambridge School District or attend Cambridge Schools. Residents support the school district through tax-dollars, while non-residents pay to participate through higher registration fees. All participants must pay in full at the time of registration; however, participation in programs to School District residents will not be denied due to financial constraints.

# **PHOTO POLICY**

The Cambridge Community Activities Program uses pictures of participants in bulletins and displays to inform others of our recreational opportunities. If you do not want a participant's picture taken, you must inform the Director in writing prior to the start of the program.

## **REFUND POLICY\***

A full refund will be issued if a program is canceled by CAP due to low enrollment or a facility usage conflict.

- If a participant voluntarily withdraws from a program prior to the program's registration deadline, he/she will receive a refund for the amount paid minus a \$3 processing fee. If payment was made via credit card, the credit card will be refunded. All other payment types will receive a refund in check form.
- If a participant withdraws after the program has begun for extenuating circumstances, or if a participant is unhappy with the program, they may submit their concerns in writing to the CAP Director. CAP may then issue a refund less the \$3 processing fee, in the Director's discretion.

\*CAP Care has a separate refund policy

#### **SUNSHINE FUND**

A private fund has been established to ensure all children are able to participate in CAP activities. We encourage all School District residents in need of financial assistance to contact the Activities Director for further information.

To ensure the safety of our participants, background checks are performed on all CAP employees and volunteers.

# **CAP CARE**

CAP CARE is a state licensed group child care facility that provides enrichment based, wrap around care and programming for children ages 3 – 11 years. CAP CARE is located in the Cambridge Elementary School, Room 129-131 & 135.

Fee: Initial \$30 registration fee.

- **3K:** \$60 per day or \$250 per week. Fee also includes attendance in First Friends
- 4K 4th grade: \$4.75 per hour for care. Parents will fill out a monthly calendar by the 21 of the preceding month of the date and times their child will be attending. No refunds/ credit will be given for any missed dates (including illness). Snacks are included in the fee. Lunch (\$3.45) may be purchased for an additional fee.

**Payments:** CAP CARE accepts check, cash, credit card, or WI Shares.

## Minimum Attendance:

- **3K:** A child must attend a minimum of two times per week.
- **4K:** A child must attend a minimum of three times per week.
- K 4: A child must attend a minimum of four times per week. This may be a combination of morning and/or afternoon periods.
